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- q The Regulation applies to all
- q Widens the definition of personal data
- q Tightens the rules for consent
- q Requirement for Data Protection Officer (DPO)
- q Requirement to conduct Data Protection Impact Assessments (DPIA)
- q Enhances rights for data subjects
- q Extends liability beyond data controllers
- q Introduces common data breach notification requirement
- q Harmonises European data protection law

How we're meeting our obligations:

- q Staff training – ELMS, Data Protection Awareness
- q Revised our corporate Privacy Notice and provided additional notices
- q Reviewed contracts with suppliers
- q Reviewing systems holding personal data
- q Reviewing the personal data we collect
- q Checking consent where it's required
- q Created additional policies and guidance notes that concentrate on key aspects of the Regulation including:
 - q Undertaking Data Protection Impact Assessments
 - q Identifying where consent may be required
 - q Data breach notification
 - q Data sharing
- q Updating cookie consent and statement
- q Finalising our information asset register and implementing a revised retention schedule
- q Appointed a Data Protection Officer
