Peak District National Park Authority Footpath Number 10 (part) Parish of Hassop Public Path Diversion Order 2015

I wrote to you on 14 October 2015 regarding the making of the above order, enclosing a copy of the Order and Notice of Making the Order. The Authority confirmed the Order on 24 November 2015, without modification.

The Order will come into force after 28 days from the date when the Authority certifies that the Works required to be undertaken have been completed to its satisfaction. However if any person aggrieved by the Order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended or any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may apply to the High Court for any of these purposes under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act before 5 January 2016.

I enclose a copy of the Notice of Confirmation of the above Order.

A copy of the confirmed Order is also enclosed.

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
THE PEAK DISTRICT NATIONAL PARK AUTHORITY
(PUBLIC FOOTPATH NO. 10 (Part) – PARISH OF HASSOP)**

PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2015

This Order is made by the Peak District National Park Authority ("the authority") under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 ("the 1980 Act") because it appears to the authority that in the interests of the owner of the land crossed by the footpath described in paragraph 1 of this order it is expedient that the line of the path should be diverted.

Mr P Hunt has agreed to defray any compensation which becomes payable in consequence of the coming into force of this order and any expenses which are incurred in bringing the new site of the path into a fit condition for use by the public.

Natural England and Derbyshire County Council have been consulted and have consented to the making of this order as required by s120(2) of the 1980 Act;

BY THIS ORDER:

1. The public right of way over the land situated at Backdale Quarry in the Parish of Hassop and shown by a bold continuous line on the attached map contained in this order and described in Part 1 of the Schedule to this order ("the Schedule") shall be stopped up after 28 days from the date when the Authority certifies the works described in Part 2 of the Schedule of this order ("the Works") have been completed to its satisfaction.
2. There shall at the end of 28 days from the date when the Authority certifies that the Works have been completed to its satisfaction be a public footpath over the land situated at Backdale Quarry in the Parish of Hassop and shown by broken black lines on the attached map.
3. Where immediately before the date there is apparatus under, in, on, over along or across it belonging to statutory undertakers for the purpose of carrying on their undertaking, the undertakers shall continue to have the same rights in respect of the apparatus as they then had.

SCHEDULE

PART 1

DESCRIPTION OF SITE OF EXISTING PATH OR WAY

The whole width of Footpath No. 10 (part) in the parish of Hassop as shown on the order map by a bold continuous line from point A at OS grid reference SK2249 7316 at Backdale, running in a north east direction for approximately 800 metres to point B at OS grid reference SK2343 7361 at its junction with the unclassified road.

PART 2

DESCRIPTION OF SITE OF NEW PATH OR WAY

A length of stone surfaced footpath 2 metres in width in the parish of Hassop as shown on the order map by bold broken line from point C at OS grid reference SK2312 7325 at the junction with Footpath 11 – Parish of Hassop, running in a north easterly direction for approximately 280 metres, then in a generally north north westerly direction for approximately 5 metres to Point D at OS Grid Reference SK 2336 7342 and then in a north easterly direction for approximately 260 metres to its junction with the unclassified road at point E at OS grid reference SK 2360 7357.
